VOTE EARLY by mail: IT IS SAFE TO VOTE FROM HOME!

Applications for Absentee Ballots can be completed NOW!
FLATTEN THE CURVE for the Board of Elections (given the work they will have with the high volume of absentee ballots).
Ballots will be mailed out beginning Oct 6th
There is a 24/7 dropbox at One Government Center, Toledo

VOTE EARLY in person: begins October 6 thru November 2 at Early Voting Center
